

LEADING BOYS TO BECOME COURAGEOUS, CARING, ETHICAL AND HEALTHY

12 TIPS...

- 1. Understand how the boy-code can restrict your boy's emotional development: Don't be a girl! Don't show your feelings! Act tough and dominate!
- 2. Learn about the unique communication needs of your boy.
- 3. Assist boys to develop an emotional vocabulary. Teach him that courage and empathy are the sources of real strength.
- 4. Create an environment where emotions are accepted. Use an "emotional barometer" when words are hard to find.
- 5. Boys often need indirect and action-talk with lots of quiet time to process their feelings and thoughts. Respect a boys desire to not want to discuss emotions.

- 6. Discuss the gender straitjacket, teasing, bullying, and other daily stresses.
- 7. As your boy gets older, seek to understand his behaviour in a peer context. To expect a boy to be able to run counter to the prevailing peer culture is to stake out the moon for a chance glimpse of a jumping cow.

Make time to get to know and appreciate his choice in friends. Also, maintain a strong rapport and caring connection with your boy. It will help you weather any storm.

9. When disciplining boys, provide clear and caring limits. Seek consequences that are: Restorative, Related, Reasonable, Respectful and Reliably enforced.

Don't back him into the corner!

Maintain a caring connection when guiding and providing discipline.

- 10. Discuss sex, intimacy and relationship issues along with the pressure to "be a stud" that is appropriate to his age level on a weekly basis!
- 11. Boys need fathers and significant males to role-model healthy masculine expressions of strong and caring emotion.
- 12. Celebrate and honour his gifts and talents. Laugh and have fun together!
